

**Victoria McGeer** divides her time between the Australian National University, where she is Professor of Philosophy, and Princeton University, where she is a Senior Research Scholar in the Center for Human Values. Her published work reflects her wide range of interests encompassing topics in moral psychology, the development of agential capacities and its impairments, responsibility, the nature of folk-psychological explanation, problems of self-knowledge, and the metaphysics of mind. Her paper, 'Mind-making practices: the social infrastructure of self-knowing agency and responsibility' was selected for inclusion in *The Philosopher's Annual* as one of the ten best philosophy articles in 2015. McGeer received her B.A. in Government and Philosophy from Dartmouth College and her M.A. and Ph.D. in Philosophy from the University of Toronto.
