

Wayne Sumner is University Professor Emeritus in the Department of Philosophy at the University of Toronto where, for more than forty years, he was a colleague of Ronnie de Sousa. His professional teaching and research have focused on ethical theory, applied ethics (especially bioethics), political philosophy, and philosophy of law. He is the author of six books: *Abortion and Moral Theory* (1981); *The Moral Foundation of Rights* (1987); *Welfare, Ethics, and Happiness* (1996); *The Hateful and the Obscene: Studies in the Limits of Free Expression* (2004); *Assisted Death: A Study in Ethics and Law* (2011), and *Physician-Assisted Death: What Everyone Needs to Know* (2017). He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada and recipient of the 2009 Molson Prize in Social Sciences and Humanities from the Canada Council for the Arts.
